Richardson Oregon All-Series Unveils 2023 North and South Rosters

Wednesday, June 7, Corvallis, Ore. – The Richardson Oregon All-Star Series, which celebrates the state's top senior 6A and 5A high school baseball players who can participate, unveiled their North and South rosters this morning, as announced by coordinators Jake Anders and Scot McDonald. The two-game showcase series is set for June 24-25 at Oregon State's Goss Stadium.

The North roster features five players from Metro League champion Jesuit High School. All five Crusaders selected are committed to playing college baseball. Infielders Ryan Cooney and Levi Jones are set to continue their careers in the Pac-12 with Cooney heading to Oregon and Jones to Oregon State. Pitcher Ty Alleman signed with WCC tournament champion Santa Clara while his two extraordinary catchers Brock Leitgeb and Charlie Sturm are Michigan and Chapman commits, respectively. Jesuit is the most represented school in the Oregon All-Star Series. Sturm hit .484, Jones had 5 home runs and Alleman went 8-1 this spring for the Crusaders.

6A state champion winning pitcher Drake Gabel of West Linn, a Seattle commit, and future Gonzaga right-hander Erik Hoffberg of Lakeridge are two aces that will represent the Three Rivers League as North pitching selections. Gabel tossed a complete game shutout in the 6A title game this past Saturday versus Jesuit.

Three Super Regional bound Oregon Ducks commits infielder Maddox Molony of 5A state champion Thurston, outfielder Trey Newman of North Medford and catcher Zach Justice of Summit highlight the South roster. Molony hit 9 home runs during the regular season for the Colts.

The South also features Mid-Willamette Conference Pitcher of the Year Max Gregg of Corvallis who posted a miniscule 0.73 ERA this spring. Gregg's dad Kevin is the head coach of Corvallis High School and pitched in the State-Metro Series in The Dalles in 1996. Kevin went on to have a successful career in the Major Leagues with the Angels, Marlins, Cubs, Blue Jays, Orioles and Reds.

The Oregon High School Baseball Coaches Association moved the series to Corvallis in 2011.
