South Breaks Out the Bats Sweeps North in Sunday Doubleheader to Take Series

Corvallis, Oregon, June 26, 2017 – After dropping the series opener to the North 11-5 on Saturday, June 24, the South came roaring back and swept the North on Sunday, June 25 as the South squad put up 21 runs over two 7-inning games. Led by Bob Brockman Oregon All-Star Series MVP Jose Chavez of Churchill, who went 4-for-7 in the series and played an exceptional center field, the South beat the North 9-5 and 12-9 to take its first series in Corvallis since 2013.

The South was led by a contingent from 5A state champion Churchill, including skipper Kenny Niles. Lancers right-hander Michael Moore was named the South's Most Outstanding Player as he picked up the win in relief in Sunday's first game, and blasted a key triple in the bottom of the first in the South's 7-run uprising in the series finale.

Churchill righty Brock Townsend was named the South Most Outstanding Pitcher for his starting outing in the series opener.

Saturday's opening game was played in triple digit temperatures.

Future Oregon Duck Kolby Somers of Century pitched 4 solid innings in the opener and collected three hits to earn North Most Outstanding Player honors.

Grant High School's Sawyer Medlin made two scoreless relief appearances for the North; tossing 2 1/3 innings combined without allowing a run and was named the North's Most Outstanding Pitcher.
